


Something I think that is very special to our school is our Summer Bridge program which is a high school orientation for the new students at our school. It's different from an orientation in the sense that it's 2 weeks long, instead of only a day, and it's completely student-led. The first week is solely for the student leaders to grow as leaders, prepare their games and workshops, and learn the ropes through things such as team building, games, and meetings. This year, my friend and I were able to bring Lucca Pretucci, a motivational speaker we heard and met at CASL last year, to host a workshop about authenticity. The student leaders then take all they've learned in the first week of Summer Bridge and apply that with the new students in week two. All of the 100+ incoming freshmen are broken up into groups for that whole week and bond through games and work on a project that falls in line with our yearly theme. This year's theme is, "High School's a Highway." We feel that Summer Bridge is so special because you're really pushed to step outside of your comfort zone and go beyond. It's nice for our incoming students because it helps them acclimate to our high school before starting the new year. When I was a freshman, the program introduced

We put a lot of emphasis on showing these students what it's like being part of our high school community, and our workshops help them reflect on what kind of person they want to be during high school. Introductions:

I am a senior at Hanford West High School in the Central Valley, and I enjoy playing tennis, reading, and spending time with my family and friends. This position is a privilege and an honor, and I'm looking forward to serving and networking with our delegates across California!

Hello, my name is Donovan Rudish! I go to Mountain House High School and I serve as the Outreach Director for this year's CASL State Board. I've been involved with leadership for 5 years and I'm incredibly excited to serve my 2nd term on the board.

How and why did you get involved with CASL?

I first learned about CASL when I "accidentally" went to the Downtown CASL Conference my freshman year. The conference was a great opportunity for me to grow alongside other students and learn a lot as a young high schooler. At Downtown CASL, I was amazed to see how passionate everyone was about making a difference on their campus and within their communities, so I made the decision later that year to run for the board. I wanted to continue making an impact on a larger level, so I joined the Ambassador program sophomore year to start sharing ideas with other leaders, then eventually was elected onto the board at the CASL Studio Conference in 2023!

It was attending the 2022 State Conference, Downtown CASL, that began my CASL journey and truly reignited my passion of serving others. The environment at the State Conference was nothing I'd ever known. It was a revitalizing experience where other student leaders took the initiative to lead chants, expressed an eagerness to learn from the curriculum and service project, and continuously networked and shared ideas from their own leadership programs. On top of this, the new state board was being elected in, and I remember watching the finalists on stage, so inspired, thinking that could be me one day. With newfound motivation, I knew from then on that I wanted to get more involved with this organization that impacted student leaders' lives for the better. What is one piece of advice you would give to student leaders?

The biggest piece of advice I would give to student leaders would be not to wait for the "perfect moment" but to make use of the time they have. I remember especially as a freshman and sophomore feeling scared to speak my mind and always feeling like I was waiting for an opportunity to be handed to me. The best thing to do is to not wait for something or someone, but to make a change (whether that be in your leadership/ASB, on your campus, or even within your community) if you see a current problem.

One piece of advice that I would give to student leaders is to prioritize not only serving others but to prioritize their own physical and mental well-being. I learned this especially during my application process running for the 2023–24 state board, and I realized that I was overworking myself and wasn't setting boundaries in order to establish a balance between my personal and school life. From then on, I became more aware of my time management, gave myself more opportunities to relax, and started setting my foot down by saying "no" to things I wasn't responsible for. By doing so, I found myself happier and more energized to do the things I loved most.

The best advice I can give is to become familiar with failure. To give an example, my leadership class tried to implement new events that we thought might be successful. Most of them didn't work out, and often times we had a period where we had to cancel or reschedule an event because of a mistake. That kind of progress became demotivating, however after one of our last new events we ended up making the most profit ever recorded from our grade.


